Standards of Care for Diabetes Management in the School Setting & Licensed Child Care Facilities – Colorado 2017

These are general standards of care for students with Type 1 Diabetes to be used in conjunction with the Colorado Provider Orders & Individualized Health Plans. The student's diabetes health care provider may indicate exceptions to these standards on the student's individual orders.

Terms used in documents:	
HIPAA:	Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act was signed into law in 1996. It provides the clarification of which are confidential or not. Parents are responsible for providing consent for the health professional, allowing for the release without additional written authorization by patient. Visit www.hhs.gov/hipaa/for-professionals/faq/113 for more.
FERPA:	Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20U) protects all personally identifiable information of students/children enrolled in institutions that receive federal funding. Requires parent written authorization to share student record information related to educational activities and related school care.
School Nurse/Child Care Nurse Consultant:	Persons whose names are included on this form will also be signed.

1. **Communication:** To facilitate appropriate execution of the Diabetes Health Care Provider's orders and to ensure safety of the student, the School Nurse/Child Care Nurse Consultant will have authorization to exchange health information with the health care provider to assist in developing, updating and correction and the Individualized Health Care Plan (IHP). The School Nurse/Child Care Nurse Consultant will have authorization to exchange health information with the health care provider at www.coloradokidswithdiabetes.org. HIPAA (HIPAA) and Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) laws apply to all information that is received by the school nurse/child care nurse consultant in collaboration with the parent/guardian to assist in health care.

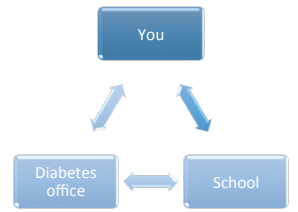

SCHOLARSHIPS

College is expensive and so is diabetes! The CDN team has compiled this list of scholarships for current and incoming college students.

NATIONAL DIABETES SCHOLARSHIPS

AAUC Frederick J. Kruse Scholarship on Health and Disability
Eligibility: Applicants must be enrolled full time in an undergraduate school as a junior or above, or be enrolled full- or part-time in a graduate school, and have a documented disability and provide documentation of their disability. Applicants must be citizens or legal residents of the US and must be enrolled in an accredited US college university. Preference will be given to students majoring in public health, disability studies or research, health promotion, or a field related to diabetes and health.
Scholarship Amounts: \$1,000
Deadline: November 15, 2017 (2018-2019 school year information not yet available)

Diabetes Incorporated
Eligibility: Diabetic high school seniors going to college, or students currently in college.
Scholarship Amounts: \$1,000
Deadline: April 15, 2018

Developmental or National Scholarship Committee for College Students with Disabilities
Eligibility: Enrolled in a 2-4 year accredited college or university in the U.S., matriculated student and attending school full time. U.S. citizens and/or of disability through Disability Student Services department, and written essay.
Scholarship Amounts: \$2,000
Deadline: March 31, 2017 (2018-2019 school year information not yet available)

Diabetes Scholars Foundation Scholarship
Eligibility: High school seniors/incoming college freshmen with diabetes.
Scholarship Amounts: \$5,000, \$4,000, \$3,000, or \$1,000
Deadline: April 15th, 2018

Los Angeles DII Attorney Diabetes Scholarship
Eligibility: Any student who has diabetes and has been accepted to, or is enrolled in, an accredited college or university in the U.S.
